# FIRS generate N1.78tn in six months, targets N1.8tn VAT

The Federal Inland Revenue Service collected a total sum of N1.782tn in tax revenue between January and July this year. The figure represents an increase in tax revenue of N224.14bn when compared to the N1.558tn collected in the same period in 2016. The Executive Chairman, FIRS, Mr. Tunde Fowler, announced this on Tuesday, while defending the budget of the agency before the Senate Committee on Finance in Abuja. He also projected raising the current N828bn annual Value Added Tax collection to N1.8tn this year, representing over 125 per cent increase. The FIRS boss said the agency had also set tax revenue targets for 2017 based on the Federal Government's 2016-2018 Medium Term Revenue Framework amounting to N4.89tn. Fowler said the FIRS budget was focused on capacity to increase VAT and other non-oil revenues. According to him, the performance of the 2017 budget will be driven by VAT collection. The service, in realisation of this responsibility and challenges of doing manual collection, has automated VAT collection for the critical sectors of the economy, notably telecommunications, airlines and financial institutions, he stated. # FG saved \$380b capital flight from Local Content Act

The Executive Secretary, Local Content Development Agency, Mr. Kesiye Wabote, has said that about \$380 billion capital flight was saved by the Federal Government from the beginning of the Local Content Act in 2010. Wabote disclosed this yesterday during the public hearing organised by the Senate Committee on Petroleum (Upstream) and Gas titled, "Implementation of Local Content and compliance with Nigerian Oil and Gas Industry Content Development Act by industry operators and investigation into the utilisation of the Nigerian Content Development Fund. The scribe, who also represented Minister of State for Petroleum Resources, Ibe Kachikwu, said before the Act was enacted, fabrication of equipment for the oil and gas industry was done abroad leading to millions of job losses. Wabote further pointed out that about \$15 billion had been ploughed back into the Nigerian economy while about 56 per cent of fabrication works are now being done in the country. He said Nigeria now handles 60,000 tonnes of fabrication works in the sector, Source: Guardian

# Nigeria's oil revenue savings among lowest globally – NEITI

The Nigeria Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative on Tuesday said it was high time the Federal Government embraced a robust policy to save a portion of oil and gas revenue for the rainy day and for the next generation. According to NEITI, the call became crucial after its findings revealed that Nigeria's oil revenue savings were among the lowest in the world despite about N70tn in earnings from the sector between 1999 and 2014. It listed the urgent measures that must be taken to include the immediate transfer of all revenue savings in the Stabilisation Fund and the Excess Crude Account to the Nigeria Sovereign Wealth Fund. The Executive Secretary, NEITI, Waziri Adio, lamented that despite the benefits and the huge revenues that had accrued from oil and gas over the years, Nigeria had one of the lowest natural resources revenue savings in the world. He noted that the country currently had three oil savings funds made up of the Sovereign Wealth Fund, with a balance of \$1.5bn; Excess Crude Account, with \$2.3bn; and the Stabilisation Fund, with N29.02bn (\$95m). The agency's boss, who spoke at a press briefing in Abuja, stated that in the last 40 years of oil production, Nigeria had extracted about 31 billion barrels of its oil reserves. Source: Punch

## ICAO, Singapore, AIB revive Nigeria's investigation laboratory

The Singaporean government and the International Civil Aviation Organisation have offered support to the Accident Investigation Bureau to revive Nigeria's \$5.8m aircraft incident/accident investigation laboratory located in the Federal Capital Territory. The AIB is the government agency responsible for the investigation of aircraft accidents and serious incidents with a view to proffering safety recommendations that can prevent reoccurrence of similar events. To enhance its capacity to determine the causes of aviation accidents, the AIB in 2011 signed a \$5.8m contract with the CEA/Flights cape of Canada to install aircraft incident investigation equipment at the AIB laboratory in Abuja. The Commissioner/Chief Executive Officer, AIB, Akin Olateru, stated that the laboratory was designed to, among other things, download information from Flight Data Recorder and Cockpit Voice Recorder, which he described as necessary requirements for a thorough and accurate accident investigation. In his speech made available to our correspondent on in Abuja after the conclusion of the first phase of training for in-house investigators of the AIB by experts from Singapore and ICAO, Olateru stated that the laboratory was installed in 2012, adding that it was used to download the flight recorders of Associated Airlines' aircraft crash of 2013. ### CBN Extends Support to Skye Bank by One Year

The Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) has extended its guarantee to Skye Bank Plc for another year, just as it continues to consider the bank's recapitalisation proposal, the bank revealed Tuesday. In an advertisement jointly signed by its Chairman and Group Managing Director, Messrs. M. K Ahmad and Tokunbo Abiru, Skye Bank said as part of efforts to stabilise the bank, it had successfully implemented its cost optimisation initiative, which has enhanced liquidity and efficient service delivery to its customers since the regulatory-induced takeover of the bank one year ago. The management of Skye Bank is very appreciative of the gracious support of the CBN by way of guarantees, support, waivers and other forbearances over the course of the last one year, which have also been extended by another year. The bank continues to require assistance from the CBN and government as it repairs the damage inflicted on the institution in the past and charts a sustainable path forward. We continue to be confronted by the antics of detractors who do not wish the bank well in hopes of escaping lawful debt obligations or accountability for misdeed. We will ensure that all those who committed infractions against the bank restitute accordingly for their actions and all debtors meet their legitimate obligations to the bank," the bank's directors said. ### Customs CG warns banks against sabotaging e-auction system

The Comptroller-General of Customs, Col. Hameed Ali (retd), on Tuesday described the non-participation of Deposit Money Banks in the electronic auction system of the Nigerian Customs Service as a sabotage of the country's economy. Ali stated this in his opening remarks at a meeting with chief executives of all the DMBs held at the headquarters of the NCS in Abuja. The meeting was convened by the CG following the refusal of 23 banks to hook up to the electronic auction platform of the NCS. Since July 3 when the electronic auction portal was launched by Ali, only Jaiz Bank Plc has hooked up to the platform with other banks refusing to participate in the scheme. The sum of N25m has so far been generated as duty from 40 items auctioned by the NCS, while 2,489 Nigerians have so far bid by logging onto the electronic auction portal. Ali said the non-participation of the banks was not acceptable to the government as their action was denying Nigerians the opportunity to benefit from the scheme. He said in addition, the government had lost huge revenue that could not be quantified due to the banks' refusal to participate in the e-auction scheme. For instance, he stated that while a lot of people had indicated interest in bidding for the seized vehicles being put up for auction, Source: Punch

## Stop giving babies water, govt tells mothers

The Federal Ministry of Health has advised mothers to stop giving water to babies under the age of six months but should rather focus on exclusive breastfeeding. The Head of Nutrition, Family Health Department, Federal Ministry of Health, Dr. Chris Isokpunwu, said this in Abuja on Monday during a high-level consultative meeting with states on accelerating nutrition result in Nigeria. Isokpunwu said statistics showed that at least 46 per cent of mothers were giving their babies breast milk and water. The doctor said this was wrong because it made the children susceptible to diseases, adding that breast milk already contained water. He said, "Babies below the age of six months should be exclusively on breast milk. About 46 per cent of mothers give water to their babies along with breast milk. This is wrong and it must be stopped. It increases the risks of babies having diarrhoea and pneumonia. Also speaking, the Minister of Health, Prof. Isaac Adewole, said Nigeria had the second highest rate of malnutrition in the world Adewole, who was represented by the Director of Family Health Department at the ministry, Dr. Adebimpe Adebiyi, said

## LASG to connect Ikorodu with Paris Club refund: States get 65% of Nigerian Schools Lack **Lagos-Ibadan Expressway**

The Lagos State Government says it has started the The Federal Government has released N243.79bn long-awaited road project, which will connect the Agric area of Ikorodu to the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway through the Arepo area of Ogun State. Governor Akinwunmi Ambode, at a stakeholders' meeting on Tuesday on the road in the Agric area of Ikorodu, requested support and cooperation of community leaders. The governor, who was represented by the Commissioner for Commerce, Industries Cooperatives, Rotimi Ogunleye, said the government approved the reconstruction had Igbe/Igbogbo/Bola Tinubu network of roads. He said, "The Agric-Isawo-Konu-Arepo Road will have a link bridge that will connect the state to the Ogun State boundary, which will link the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway. Ambode said the road would be a dual carriageway, with lay-bys in some areas, adding that the road would serve as another link to Sagamu. The Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Works and Infrastructure, Temidayo Erinle, said the first phase of the road construction would begin 400 metres from the Ikorodu Road at Agric bus stop, with a total length of over seven kilometres. He said the approval for the payments was done on May 4 by President Muhammadu Buhari in partial settlement of longstanding claims by state governments relating to over-deduction from their allocations from the Federation Account for external debts service arising between 1995 and 2002. A breakdown of the N243.79bn showed that five states received the highest amount of N10bn each.

Speaking at the 9th edition of the annual Wole Soyinka Centre Media Lecture series, with theme, Light up, Light in: Interrogating the Nexus between Electricity and Basic Education in Nigeria', held at the Shehu Musa Yar'Dua Centre, Federal Capital Territory (FCT), Abuja, stakeholders in attendance including the Executive Secretary of UBEC, Dr. Hamid Bobboyi; former Minister of Education, Dr. Obiageli Ezikwesili, among others, emphasised the importance of electricity to quality education delivery. He said energy crisis in Africa has, and will continue to be a tragedy to the continent of Africa, saying out of the 1.5 billion people who lack access to electricity globally, 57 per cent, amounting to 622.6 million are in Africa.
