Finally, NNPC pays N450br Federation Account debt

The Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation has finally offset its indebtedness of N450bn to the Federation Account. The Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Finance, Mahmoud Isa-Dutse, confirmed the development at a media briefing shortly after the Federation Accounts Allocation Committee meeting in Abuja on Thursday. The N450bn indebtedness has been a subject of controversy since 2010 following discoveries that the corporation failed to remit part of the revenue it generated for the country to the Federation Account. The corporation had failed to remit the money despite persistent pressure mounted by the then Chairman of FAAC and former Minister of State for Finance, Mr. Remi Babalola. While the NNPC had claimed that it was insolvent, and as such, did not have the resources to settle the debt, Babalola had maintained that the fund must be remitted. The wrangling led to the redeployment of the minister to the Ministry of Special Duties, a development that led to his resignation in 2011. However, after much pressure by state governors, the corporation agreed to a monthly repayment plan of N6.33bn from September 2011. Speaking after this month's FAAC meeting held at the headquarters of the Ministry of Finance in Abuja, Dutse said, "About the NNPC repayment. Source: Punch

N450bn Etisalat, lenders disagree over \$1.2bn loan repayment

The controversies surrounding Etisalat Nigeria's indebtedness to a consortium of 13 banks deepened on Thursday with the telecoms firm insisting that it had repaid about 42 per cent of the \$1.2bn loan, while some of the banks involved in the transaction maintained that it had "only paid \$58.9m. Sources privy to the series of meetings between Etisalat and the banks, said that the \$58.9m was just 10 per cent of the total sum owed the consortium by the telecommunications company. However, Etisalat Nigeria said in a statement by its Vice President, Regulatory and Corporate Affairs, Ibrahim Dikko, "Contrary to the widely reported misrepresentations about Etisalat Nigeria's debt obligation to the consortium of 13 banks, it has become pertinent to set the records straight. Prior to this time, Etisalat had in fact consistently and conscientiously met up with its payment obligations. As of today, we can categorically state that the outstanding loan sum to the consortium stands at \$227m and N113bn, a total of about \$574m if the naira portion is converted to US dollars. This means almost half of the original loan of \$1.2bn has been repaid. Etisalat continued to service the loan up until February 2017, Source: Punch

Crude Oil Bounces Back Above \$45 Per Barrel, Despite Glut

Crude oil Thursday edged up from multi-month low, but prices remained under pressure from a supply glut that has persisted despite the efforts led by the Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) to balance the market. Brent crude futures were up 60 cents Thursday at \$45.42 per barrel, after falling as low as \$44.53. They fell 2.6 per cent in the previous session to \$44.35, their lowest since November 2016. US crude futures were up 40 cents at \$42.93 a barrel, after also slipping. On Wednesday, they touched \$42.05 per barrel, their lowest intraday level since August 2016. Since peaking at \$55 per barrel in late February, crude has dropped around 20 per cent, erasing gains recorded at the end of 2016, in the wake of the initial OPEC-led production cut. OPEC and other producers agreed to reduce output by 1.8 million barrels per day (bpd) from January for six months, and last month extended the deal for a further nine months until March 2018. However, oversupply has persisted, particularly with output rising in Libya and Nigeria, which were exempt from the cuts due to unrest that had limited their output. Source: Thisday

FG to mobilise N2.5bn investment for YouWin SMEs

The Federal Government on Thursday said it would mobilise the sum of N2.5bn annually as equity investment through qualified fund managers for Small and Medium Enterprises under the Youth With Innovation Entrepreneurship programme. The development was confirmed in a statement by the Ministry of Finance and signed by the Director of Information in the ministry, Mr. Salisu Dambatta. The YouWin programme is an initiative of the Finance ministry, which aims to support young entrepreneurs as they plan, start and grow their businesses. It seeks to promote entrepreneurship as a viable career option for young Nigerians, who in turn, will create jobs and wealth. The additional impact of the scheme will include social inclusion, job creation, youth empowerment and improved human capital, according to the government. The ministry said that the need to attract co-investment funding for the SMEs under the scheme was borne out of the conviction that it would help to stimulate and sustain the Economic Recovery and Growth Plan being implemented by the Federal Government. It said since SMEs were the engine of growth in an economy, adding that any fund attracted to the sector would promote industrialisation and job creation. Source: Punch

2017 budget: NASS under attack for slashing, Lagos-Ibadan road, others' votes

Prominent groups and economic experts have criticised the National Assembly for reducing the budgetary allocations for projects such as the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway and the Second Niger Bridge. The lawmakers reduced the budget for the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway from N31bn to N10bn, while the vote for the Second Niger Bridge was cut from N15bn to N10bn. But as against N115bn budgeted for the federal lawmakers in 2016, the National Assembly hiked its budget to N125bn in 2017. Condemning the lawmakers, civil rights organisations said the National Assembly, by slashing allocations for the projects and increasing its own votes, had shown that it was selfish. The News Agency of Nigeria had earlier on Thursday reported that the Minister of Power, Works and Housing, Mr. Babatunde Fashola (SAN), had raised the alarm over the insertion of projects outside the purview of his ministry into the 2017 Appropriation Act by the National Assembly. Fashola said it was unfair to the executive arm for the inclusion of such projects after public hearings on the budget and defence of the fiscal estimates by the ministries. FG, States, LGs Share N462bn for May as Allocation Improves

A total of N462.359 billion was shared by the three tiers of government for the month of May, an increase over the N415.7 billion distributed for April. A breakdown showed that Value Added Tax (VAT) accounted for N76.786 billion; statutory revenue, N317.562 billion, and exchange rates differential of N64.812 billion. The figures were unveiled by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Finance, Dr. Mahmoud Isa-Dutse, at a briefing after the monthly meeting of the Federation Account Allocation Committee (FAAC) presided over by him. He disclosed that the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation (NNPC), which had been defraying its N450 billion indebtedness to FAAC monthly at N6.7 billion had liquidated the debt. From the statutory allocation, the federal government got N147.682 billion; states, N74.906 billion; local governments, N57.750 billion while N20.505 billion went to the oil-producing areas as 13 per cent derivation. According to Mahmoud, the gross statutory revenue of N317.562 billion received for the month was more than the N274.110 billion received in the preceding month by N43.452 billion, adding that everything would be done to ensure salaries were paid to civil servants before the Sallah celebration. The slight drop in the average price of crude oil from \$55.38 to \$55.18 per barrel and a decrease in export volume by 1.023 million barrels, reduced oil revenue by about \$57.12 million. Common water treatments could damage genetic material

Scientists are warning that a water treatment widely used in developing countries could be damaging the Deoxy Ribonucleic Acid (DNA)/genetic material of those drinking it. Despite poor evidence of their effectiveness as a water disinfectant, colloidal silver and silver nanoparticles are increasingly being promoted for treating potentially contaminated drinking water in low income countries. A study led by the University of East Anglia has concluded that there is a risk these treatments could in fact cause genotoxicity, which is damage to DNA, and affect reproduction and future generations. Prof Paul Hunter from UEA's Norwich Medical School, said the study brings together existing research to highlight the potential risks. "Colloidal silver as a water treatment is sold across Africa and in countries like Haiti, despite the fact it doesn't treat water very

Hair dye, chemical relaxers can elevate risk of developing breast cancer

Common salon hair treatments can drastically increase the risk of breast cancer, a study suggests. Researchers at Rutgers University found there was an alarming increase in risk of developing the disease when certain women used dark hair dye and chemical relaxers. Black women who dyed their hair had a 51 percent increase in risk and white women who used relaxers had a 74 percent increase in risk. Previous research has suggested there was a link between harsh hair treatments and breast cancer, but most studies don't include black women. Now experts are using these findings to further investigate the danger of using chemical products on the body. The study

Some parents aid sexual abuse in children'

An official of Stop Sexual Abuse Now, a non-governmental organisation, Nkem Ijeh, has said that the attitude of some parents is responsible for the prevalence of sexual abuse in the country. According to her, some parents coerce their children into silence because of socio-economic reasons. She said this recently during the ninth edition of the annual Career Guidance and Counselling seminar organised by the Goge Africa Foundation. More than 3,000 pupils from public and private schools in Lagos State attended the programme themed, Youths against Violence. She said, "Some parents even threaten their children not to speak out after being harassed all because the person who committed the crime is the bread winner of the family. Source: Punch

The Gunners' star, voted man of the match, became Chile's all-time top-scorer with his 38th international goal after capitalising on an early mistake in the German defence. Sanchez has yet to sign a new deal with Arsenal and pointedly ignored a question about his future as he accepted the man-of-the-match award. Sanchez blanks Arsenal talk as CAF Warns Egyptian Clubs to Stay off Qatar Crisis

The Confederation of African Football (CAF) has issued a thinly-veiled warning to Egyptian clubs to stay out of the political crisis in the Gulf. Long-simmering tensions between Qatar and its neighbours boiled over earlier this month when Saudi Arabia and many other Arab states cut all ties with Qatar over the oil and gas-rich kingdom's alleged support for terrorism. Qatar, the 2022 World Cup host nation, has rejected the accusations. The political earthquake in the Gulf has also affected beIN Sports - the Qatari sports network which has the sole rights in the Middle East to broadcast tournaments such as the Africa Cup of Nations and the World Cup. Being Sports, which also has exclusive rights to the African Champions League and Confederation Cup, has been blocked in many Gulf countries over the crisis. Earlier this month, the
