The Bankers Committee of the Central Bank on Thursday declared that there was adequate stock of foreign exchange to sustain the spate of dollar sales to various segments of forex market. The regulator stressed that it was in possession of adequate stock of dollars to ensure that it met the demands of all genuine bank customers in the country. The Director, Banking Supervision, CBN, Ahmed Abdullahi, said this at a press briefing held along some chief executive officers of banks shortly after the committee's meeting in Lagos. The naira depreciated from 388 per United States dollar on Wednesday to 390/dollar on Thursday as the Central Bank of Nigeria continued to intervene in the foreign exchange market to boost the local currency. The local unit has been hovering between 385/dollar and 390/dollar in the last one week. ### Bankers' Committee gets tough with e-fraudsters

BANKERS yesterday warned e-fraudsters to behave or be taken off the banking system. Speaking for the Bankers' Committee, Access Bank Managing Director Herbert Wigwe said banks were working out modalities that would enable them establish a central database to identify and punish e-fraud perpetrators. Data from the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) has shown e-fraud has been on the rise. Although e-fraud rate in terms of value dropped by 63 per cent in nearly two years, after the introduction of the Bank Verification Number (BVN) and improved collaboration among banks via the fraud desks, the total fraud volume rose significantly by 683 per cent within the period. Also, Nigeria experienced nearly 3,500 cyberattacks with 70 per cent success rate and loss of \$450 million within the last two years, mainly through cross channel fraud, data theft, e-mail spooling, phishing, shoulder surfing and underground websites. ### U.S. based businessman to set up \$2bn dollar modular refinery in Edo

U.S.-based businessman, Mr Charles Ihaza, says he has acquired about 453.9 hectares of land to establish a modular refinery in Eghudu, Ovia North East Local Government Area of Edo. Ihaza said this at an Open Forum organised on Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) of the proposed refinery in Benin. He said that the project would cost over two billion U.S. dollars, adding that the refinery would produce about 80,000 barrels of refined petroleum products daily. "I know what it takes to establish and manage a refinery, and we are

already discussing with the relevant Federal Government agencies on the immediate commencement of the project. "I decided to site the refinery in Eghudu so as to help our people back home in Nigeria, and I am very passionate about this project. Source: The Nation

### Nigeria, China to raise bilateral trade

Nigeria and China are hoping to increase volume of bilateral trade as they intensify areas of cooperation between the two nations. This was the highpoint of the first edition of the Nigeria Governors' Investment Forum held some days ago in Guangzhou, China, which they said was meant to foster transnational investments between Nigeria and China. Participants from the two countries conducted in-depth discussions and case sharing on the theme of the forum 'Sustainable cities and livelihood', according to a statement by the organisers. The statement quoted the Vice Mayor of Guangzhou, Mr. CaiChaolin, as saying that Nigeria, as the largest economy in Africa, and Guangdong were highly complementary to each other in areas such as manufacturing, agriculture, cultural exchanges and infrastructure development. 
