Forex: CBN bars 16 banks from SME window

The Central Bank of Nigeria on Tuesday wielded the big stick on 16 Deposit Money Banks as it stopped them from participating in the Small and Medium-scale Enterprises window of the foreign exchange market. The apex bank said this in a statement issued by its Acting Director, Corporate Communications Department, Mr. Isaac Okorafor. He said the decision to stop the banks from participating in the SME wholesale window of the forex market was taken following series of complaints that some of them were deliberately frustrating efforts by many SMEs to access forex from the window. The apex bank had last month created the SME wholesale window to make it easier for small-scale businesses to access forex to import critical materials for their operations. The CBN explained in the statement that based on field reports, only eight banks had sold forex to the SMEs segment since the inception of the new window. The apex bank noted that only the eight banks would be allowed to access forex in that segment of the financial market henceforth. Source: Punch

Extra-budgetary bailout for states hits N1.75 trillion

The Federal Government has in the last two years supported states financially to the tune of N1.75 trillion. The funds were, however, "extra-statutory," as they were not captured in the budget. The revelation contained in a recent survey by a fiscal research agency, BudgIT, comes in the wake of the approval being sought by the government for its \$30 billion three-year debt plan, which also includes states' deals in addition to other obligations and service charges. There is the fear that the nonfunctional budget systems at the states coupled with misappropriation, non-implementation development plans as well as persistent debt deals may thwart the nation's ambitious global economic blueprint, Vision 20:2020. It is even being held that these anomalies would increase poverty in all the sub-national territories before the time. Source: Guardian

World Bank expects oil prices to hit \$60 per barrel in 2018

The World Bank has retained its forecast for crude oil prices this year at \$55 per barrel, but its projecting a price increase of \$60 a barrel by 2018, owing to production cutback of petroleum exporting countries. In its April Commodity Markets Outlook report released recently, the World Bank said it is holding steady its crude oil price forecast for this year at \$55 per barrel, but noted of a projected increase to an average of \$60 per barrel in 2018. Rising oil prices, supported by production cutbacks by the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) and non-OPEC states, will allow markets to gradually rebalance," the World Bank said. The World Bank noted that the oil price forecasts are subject to downside risks should the rebound in the US shale oil industry be greater than expected. Crude oil inventories have remained high, mainly in the United States, but are expected to start declining in the second quarter as seasonal refinery demand picks up," the report said. In contrast, the World Bank noted that prices of energy commodities, which include natural gas and coal, are projected to rise 26 percent this year and eight percent in 2018. Natural gas price is forecast to go up by 15 per cent this year, led by a jump in US prices. Similarly, Source: Guardian

MTN explains sack of 280 workers

South African telecommunications firm, MTN has explained the rationale behind the disengagement of some of its employees in Nigeria. Though the company is still officially silent about the actual number of those that were sacked, but reports said about 280 employees were on Friday relieved of their jobs, an exercise, which MTN described as being voluntary. A statement from the telecommunications firm yesterday in Lagos, signed by the Public Relations and Protocol Manager, Corporate Services Division, Funso Aina, showed that the process was a fallout of MTN's Voluntary Severance Scheme designed to balance individual employee needs with business exigencies. The firm explained that the scheme was designed, drawing on feedback from employees and following consultation with elected employee representatives. According to the statement: "It provides a financial incentive and opportunity for employees who have worked with MTN for over five years to pursue other career interests and personal ambitions full-time, while increasing opportunities for professionals with a fresh perspective wishing to join the MTN family. Dangote Sugar to raise N21 bn from capital market

DANGOTE Sugar Refinery, DSR Plc, has revealed plans to raise N21.2 billion through equity injection from the capital market to fund its backward integration project and also actualise the Dangote Sugar Master Plan. The Group Managing Director, Mr. Abdullahi Sule, who made the disclosure, yesterday, at the company's 'facts behind the figure' presentation at the Nigerian Stock Exchange, NSE, said the fresh capital would be raised before the end of 2017 financial year. He explained that the N21.2 billion will form part of the N106 billion budgeted by the company to finance its operations within the next six years, adding that the Board of Directors was in the process of finalising plan for the capital raising and to decide the right mix of funding.

NNPC, Chevron, Total to build two power plants

The Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation has said it has engaged its joint venture partners, Chevron and Total, to build power plants in Obite and Agura. The Group Managing Director, NNPC, Dr. Maikanti Baru, stated this at the ongoing Offshore Technology Conference in Houston, Texas, United States. The GMD, who was represented by the Chief Operating Officer, Gas and Power, Mr. Saidu Mohammed, was quoted to have said in a statement, "Essentially, the NNPC has been there. Many people don't know that the NNPC has been part of the power sector. We supply steadily about 1,000 megawatts from Afam and Okpai, two of Nigeria's most reliable power plants, serving as one of the cheapest sources of power today in the country. Baru said the NNPC's role in the power sector would be enhanced with the completion of the power plants that it had started and most especially the three mega plants in Abuja, Kaduna and Kano, with combined capacity of 3,000MW. According to him, the NNPC is attending the OTC 2017 in order to attract potential investors and showcase its efforts at transforming into a full-fledged energy company. Source: Punch

Artificial womb' improves premature babies' survival

A unique womb-like environment designed by pediatric researchers could transform care for extremely premature babies, by mimicking the prenatal fluid-filled environment to give the tiniest newborns a precious few weeks to develop their lungs and other organs. Our system could prevent the severe morbidity suffered by extremely premature infants by potentially offering a medical technology that does not currently exist," said study leader Alan W. Flake, MD, a fetal surgeon and director of the Center for Fetal Research in the Center for Fetal Diagnosis and Treatment at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP), United States (US). Flake and colleagues report on preclinical studies of their extrauterine support device in Nature Communications. They tested and monitored effects on fetal lambs, in which prenatal lung development is very similar to that occurring in humans. The innovative system uses a unique fluid-filled container attached to custom-designed machines that provide physiologic support. The fetal lambs grow in a temperature-controlled, near-sterile environment, breathing amniotic fluid as they normally do in the womb. Source: Guardian

Obesity, overweight rising among Nigerian children — STUDY

A NEW report - the "2016 Nigerian Report Card on Physical Activity for Children and Youth" which focuses on physical activity as a major determinant of Non Communicable Diseases, NCDs, has revealed rising prevalence of overweight and obesity among Nigerian children. According to the Report, schools are not complying with stipulated standard in physical activity. Modelled after the Canadian Report, the Nigerian Report Card showed that 12 percent of Nigerian children are obese and overweight. It also showed that there was no change from the 2013 report which showed that 90.9 percent of Nigerian children and youth in the urban and rural areas spend over three hours on screen time daily. Television viewing is 90.7 per cent. The Report recommended that National guidelines on physical activity levels and sedentary behaviour for Nigerian children and youth should be formulated.
