CBN Mops up N200bn in Special Naira to gain further on stock **OMO**

As part of efforts to strengthen the decelerating level of inflation, the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) Thursday unveiled plans to mop up a total of N200.322 billion from the Nigerian banking system through a special Open Market Operation (OMO) at the rate of 16 per cent per annum. Rising from a meeting of the Bankers' Committee in Lagos. the CBN said its decision to mop up liquidity was in reaction to the maturing of N206 billion Thursday. CBN's Acting Director in charge of Corporate Communication, Isaac Okorafor, further explained that the central bank decided on the rate of 16 per cent per annum due to the falling rate of inflation, which he noted will continue to fall. The CBN had on Monday released its Treasury Bills Issue Programme for the third guarter of 2017 in which it disclosed that the maturity dates for the various tenors will be June 15, June 22, July 6, July 20, August 3, August 17 and August 31, 2017, respectively. The naira is expected to strengthen against the United States dollar in the coming week as offshore investors pile into local stocks, currency and financial analysts have said. According to them, the naira will likely strengthen against the dollar in the coming days as more offshore investors buy up local stocks after MSCI increased the country's weighting in its frontier market index. "We are beginning to see some international investors returning to the (stock) market," a research analyst, Olabisi Avodeii, told Reuters. Traders said the reemergence of offshore interest in the stock market had boosted dollar inflows to the economy, leading to a gradual exchange rate convergence. The naira was quoted at 365 to the dollar on the black market on Thursday, against 368 per dollar Source: Punch

Nigeria spends N4.69trn on petrol import, demurrage

The Federal Government is expected to save N4.69 trillion yearly from massive importation of petroleum products, as it plans to become a net exporter by end of 2019, according to statistics released by the Federal Ministry of Petroleum Resources. Besides, the Ministry, which said that no financiers have been selected for the rehabilitation of refineries in the country, disclosed that government plans to formally engage a pool of financiers after cost estimates have been firmed up this June. The ministry said that 20 million metric tonnes of Premium Motor Spirit (PMS) also known as petrol valued at N3.35 trillion was imported into Nigeria from January to December 2016. It added that the country spent N1.34 trillion yearly due to shipping and demurrage caused by inadequate port receipt facilities, as indicated in a document detailing Federal Government's plans to rehabilitate Source: Guardian

The Federal Government is targeting an increase in the number of taxpayers in the next two years from the current 14 million to 17 million. The Minister of Finance, Mrs. Kemi Adeosun, disclosed this during a media briefing on Thursday in Abuja on a new initiative to drive tax revenue. Adeosun was accompanied to the briefing by the Executive Chairman, Federal Inland Revenue Service, Mr. Babatunde Fowler, and other top officials in the ministry. Specifically, she said the Federal Government was planning to achieve the objective by recruiting 7,500 graduates as community tax liaison officers to raise the level of tax awareness in the country. She said the graduates would be recruited under the N-Power programme of the Federal Government for a two-year period, adding that graduates with accounting, economics and similar backgrounds would be given priority during the recruitment process. The minister stated that the major responsibilities of those employed under the programme would be to enlighten people in public places such as markets, schools, religious centres, offices and recreational centres, among others, on the need to pay taxes. Adeosun said, "We will be recruiting them through N-Power and they can apply through the website of the Federal

Ministry of Finance or through the N-Power website. It's a two year fixed contract and they will be deployed in states and attached to states' internal revenue service or the FIRS. Source: Punch

Petrol price: FG rules out total deregulation

The Federal Government on Thursday announced that it had ruled out the total deregulation of the downstream oil and gas sector so as not to raise the pump price of Premium Motor Spirit, popularly known as petrol. It noted that any attempt to enforce a total deregulation of the sector would lead to an increase in the prices of petroleum products, adding that it was aware of the severe consequence that this would have on Nigerians. Speaking at the 2017 African Modular Refinery Discussion organised in Abuja by the Modular Refineries Association of Nigeria, Acting President Yemi Osinbajo, noted that despite calls for the complete deregulation of the downstream oil sector, the government would not do so but would continue to moderate activities in the industry. He said, "There are those who are saying we need to deregulate fully. Why are they saying that? It is because if we do not deregulate, it is not cost-effective for those who are producing PMS to sell. At the same time, if you deregulate completely, prices of everything will go up. Inflation drops from 17.24% to 16.25% – NBS

The National Bureau of Statistics on Thursday released the Consumer Price Index, which measures inflation, with the index dropping from 17.24 per cent in April to 16.25 per cent year-on-year in May. The NBS stated that on a month-on-month basis, the headline index rose by 1.88 per cent in May, representing a 0.28 percentage points higher than the 1.60 per cent recorded in April. The report read in part, "The Consumer Price Index, which measures inflation, increased by 16.25 per cent (year-on-year) in May 2017 compared to 17.24 per cent in April. "On a month-on-month basis, the headline index increased by 1.88 per cent in May 2017, 0.28 percentage points higher than the rate of 1.60 per cent recorded in April 2017 "Food inflation increased by 19.27 per cent (year-on-year) in May 2017, down by 0.03 per cent points from the rate recorded in April of 19.30 per cent." The NBS report stated that on a month-on-month basis, the food sub-index increased by 2.54 per cent in May, up by 0.50 percentage points from 2.04 per cent recorded in April. Source: Punch

Body Odour is Preventable

Body odour is the unpleasant smell that can occur when one is sweating. Although, human sweat is mostly odourless, however, the bacteria that live on the skin can break down the sweat into acids, which produces an unpleasant odour. Medically speaking this condition is equally known as bromhidrosis, apocrine bromhidrosis, bromidrosis, osmidrosis, ozochrotia, fetid sweat or malodorous sweating. Most people who have passed puberty can produce body odour. Somehow, it can be assumed as one of the secondary sexual characteristics in the grownups. Puberty usually occurs between 12-16 years of age in girls, and 13-17 years of age in boys. Body odour can be made worse by following conditions/situations: Obesity, eating a diet that is high in spicy foods and having certain medical conditions, such as diabetes. Also of relevance here is the fact that body odour is commoner in men, since men tend to sweat more than women. Body odor is known to be largely influenced by Major Histocompatibility Complex (MHC) molecules present in the blood and body fluids. Source:

The United Nations Information for Nigeria and the Onome Akinlolu Majaro Foundation have jointly condemned the stigmatisation and discrimination of persons living with albinism in Nigeria, describing the action as inhuman. They said while those violating the rights of albinos should be brought to book, there should be swift prosecution of perpetrators of attacks against persons with albinism. Speaking during the commemoration of the International Albinism Awareness Day in Lagos by OAM Foundation, the Director, United Nations Information for Nigeria, Mr. Ronald Kayanja said reports have shown that persons living with albinism were been hunted for rituals and amulets which have resulted in the killing of countless persons living with albinism. Mr. Ronald expressed that for a person to be affected by albinism, both parents must carry the gene and in that case, there is a 25percent chance that a child will be born with albinism at each pregnancy. Police arrest player, 30 others for robbery, kidnapping

No fewer than 28 suspected robbers and three kidnappers have been arrested by the police in Bayelsa State. The state Commissioner of Police, Asuquo Amba, paraded the suspects in Yenagoa on Thursday. Among those paraded by the police boss was a Bayelsa United Feeders' Club player, Emmanuel Tabofa, 23; a suspected armed robber on police wanted list, Precious Emobo; and a suspected kidnapper, Kelepre Kelepre. Amba said the suspects were arrested between May and June. The CP said, "On June 3. one Mrs. Miekumo Jonah of Akenpai community in Yenagoa kidnapped by unknown gunmen at her residence."Policemen swung into action, which led to the arrest of Asuka Nyrzedukpe, 25, and one David Ovuru, 18, of Okulagba Street, Akenpai on June 9. The suspects have confessed to their involvement in the kidnap. "Also, Kelepre Kelepre, of Foropa community in Southern Ijaw Local Government Area of Bayelsa State, masterminded the kidnap of one Mrs. Ikiou Munemune of Assemblies of God Church Road, Agudama Epie, Yenagoa. The hotel. which was on Tuesday sealed off by the Federal Inland Revenue Service for tax default, is owned by former Minister of State for Education, Olorogun Kenneth Gbagi. The deceased, who had earlier been declared missing by both families, were allegedly found floating in the swimming pool of the hotel on Wednesday. The victims were pupils of Challenge International School in Kolokolo, Enerhen, also in Uvwie Council Area of the state. but were transferred to take their at Continental International examinations School, where one of their teachers identified as Robinson allegedly collected N500 from each pupils to swim at the hotel.
