\$1.2bn debt: Etisalat loses 2.9 million subscribers

Etisalat Nigeria's \$1.2bn debt burden may have taken a toll on its operations as over 2.9 million subscribers left its network in six months, OZIOMA UBABUKOH reports. One of Nigeria's major telecommunications companies, Etisalat, lost over 2.9 million subscribers in the last two quarters, The PUNCH has learnt. Findings by our correspondent showed that as of September 2016, there were 22.5 million active subscribers on the network but the figure dropped to 20.8 million by December. This represents a loss of 1.7 million subscribers within three months. The drop, thus, represents a loss of about N3.1bn potential revenue for Etisalat for the quarter, going by the industry's average revenue of N1,830 per user, according to the quarterly subscriber operation data obtained from the Nigerian Communications Commission. Similarly, in the first guarter of this year, the telco lost 1.2 million subscribers. This is also estimated to cost the telecoms company potential revenue of about N3.8bn.Fact checks showed that between September last year and end of March, this year, Globacom increased its subscribers from 36.9 million to 37.3 million; Airtel grew from 34.1 million to 34.6 million but MTN dropped in subscriptions from 60.5 million to 60.3 million. Naira appreciates to 386/dollar

The naira has appreciated to 386 against the United States dollar as the Central Bank of Nigeria continues to supply dollars into the foreign exchange market. The local unit closed at 386/dollar on Friday, having closed at 390/dollar daily in the past one week. The CBN had supplied over \$380m into the forex market a week ago. According to financial and currency experts, the naira's outlook remains stable in the near term as the regulator steps up efforts to improve dollar liquidity and achieve exchange rate convergence. The naira firmed to about 305.60 to the dollar on the interbank market on Friday, up from 305.1/dollar on Thursday. The Global Economist. Renaissance Capital. Charles Robertson, described the official rate of the naira as a "fair value", suggesting that the value might need to be weaker to attract foreign investors into the country. According to him, exchange rate issues are making Nigeria to underperform among its peers in East Africa. He, however, said the country would make significant improvement in ease of doing business and corruption data over the next one year owing to recent positive steps by the Federal Government. Foreign Direct Investments will increase in Nigeria

Umana explained that the authority's new disposition stemmed from a management retreat, where a roadmap to deal with foundational issues of the agency was initiated. Arik, Aero may merge as national carrier

A likely merger and conversion of assets of Arik Air and Aero Contractors is one of the options being considered by the Federal Government (FG) in the buildup to a new national carrier for the country. The option, according to sources, is due to the alleged debt burden of the airlines. Besides, despite government's recent intervention since their takeover by the Assets Management Corporation of Nigeria (AMCON), the airlines are not promising in terms of operations and debt payment. The conversion plan, though already faulted by some stakeholders, will further reduce private domestic operations to six airlines, with the attendant debt burden and legal issues for the prospective national carrier. The antagonists urged the government to start the airline from the scratch, ensuring it is publicly owned and free from political interference. The defunct Nigeria Airways was the country's national and flag carrier between 1958 and 2003. The airline, fully owned by the Federal Government, was liquidated over mismanagement, corruption and over-staffing, with its indebtedness put in the region of \$78 million (N23.8 billion). While its asset was bought over by Arik Air in 2007, no fewer than 6000 workers were still being owed severance packages to the tune of N78 billion. Floating a new choice flag carrier has been on the front burner of discourses by the current administration since 2015. The government, penultimate week, appointed advisers to help set it up and develop its aviation infrastructure. said. Source: Guardian

EFCC investigates electricity theft by consumers

The Economic and Financial Crimes Commission has started investigating alleged collusion by some electricity consumers, power firms' workers and meter manufacturers to steal electricity by bypassing the meter. According to the Federal Ministry of Power, Works and Housing, the investigation by the EFCC is part of efforts aimed at curbing the incidence of energy theft in the Nigerian electricity supply industry. It specifically said the anti-graft agency was carrying out the investigation in some of the areas covered by the Ibadan Electricity Distribution Company. In a statement issued by the ministry on Sunday, it said, "Ibadan Electricity Distribution Company noted that collusion by some of its employees, customers and meter manufacturers to bypass meters has been reported to the EFCC and is under investigation." The ministry further observed that the Transmission Company of Nigeria had restored the Katampe 60MVA substation in Abuja and the 40 MVA mobile substation in Damboa, Borno State. It said the Makeri to Pankshin 132kV line in Plateau and Okpella line in Edo State were both expected to be switched on in August 2017, adding that the installation of new circuit breaker in Egbin was scheduled for inauguration on May 19, 2017. 

says Intercontinental Hotel over Alleged **Debt**

The Federal High Court in Lagos has ordered Skye Bank Plc to take over Intercontinental Hotel over an alleged debt. It appointed a Senior Advocate of Nigeria (SAN), Mr. Kunle Ogunba, as the hotel's receiver-manager in order to preserve its assets. The hotel, with 361 rooms, is on Plot 244 and 245 (now 52) Kofo Abayomi Street on Victoria Island in Lagos. Justice Babs Kuewumi ordered Skye Bank Plc to take herdsman by the villagers during a disagreement. He said the disagreement occurred between some Fulani youths and members of the community. The herdsmen were said to have maintained a settlement near the community on the understanding that a percentage of the proceeds from their harvest would go to the village head. However a disagreement was said to have ensued when the herdsmen failed to remit the agreed fee to the village head at the end of the last cropping season. The herdsmen, it was learnt, later claimed that the parcel of land belonged to them. But the community was said to have demanded for the agreed amount, Source: Thisday
